Ancestral Sites Tour

Meet at Visitor Center 10:00 a.m., 1 hour, Daily

Pecos Pueblo sits at the site of a unique ecological and cultural crossroads. Join a park ranger to learn about the Ancestral Pueblo, Spanish Colonial history, and the importance of this site to communities today. One mile walk with moderate elevation gain. Bring water, sunscreen, and walking shoes.
